Day 1: Australia – Los Angeles

Wave goodbye to your family and friends – your journey to Los Angeles, California begins today!

Upon arrival you'll head straight to **Venice Beach** and **Santa Monica**. Known for its bohemian spirit, Venice is a buzzing beach town with upscale commercial and residential pockets. Free-spirited **Venice Boardwalk** is the site of funky shops, street performers and colourful murals. There's also a skate park and Muscle Beach outdoor gym. At nearby **Santa Monica** you can explore the famous boardwalk or experience some thrilling rides at **Pacific Park** on the **Santa Monica Pier!**

Afterwards, transfer to your hotel in Anaheim. Enjoy dinner at **Amber Waves** restaurant upon your arrival.

Day 2: Guided Gallery Hopping

Los Angeles is known for their world class art galleries and artistic diversity. Today you get to experience some of the most unique and innovative galleries in Los Angeles with a **full day of Gallery hopping**, accompanied by your very own local art guide to spark your design thinking and appreciation of aesthetics.

Galleries visited today will cover many different art methods and techniques, highlighting the elements of Art. Galleries will likely include:

The Broad – The Broad is a contemporary art museum on Grand Avenue in Downtown Los Angeles. The museum is named for philanthropist Eli Broad, who financed the \$140 million building which houses the Broad art collections.

Gallery 1988 – Since its opening in 2004, Gallery1988 has become one of the nation's most talked about art galleries. Sitting on the world-famous shopping mecca of Melrose Ave (now at 7308 Melrose), G1988 was opened by California natives Katie Sutton and Jensen Karp, and was the first pop-culture focused art gallery in the world, as well as a premiere venue to witness the rise of emerging artists before they break.

Geffen Contemporary – A former police car warehouse in L.A.'s Little Tokyo Historic District, renovated by the noted California architect Frank Gehry, The Geffen Contemporary at MOCA (formerly The Temporary Contemporary) opened in 1983.

LACMA – LACMA (Los Angeles County Museum of Art) is the largest art museum in the western United States, with a collection of more than 142,000 objects that illuminate 6,000 years of artistic expression across the globe. Committed to showcasing a multitude of art histories, LACMA exhibits and interprets works of art from new and unexpected points of view that are informed by the region's rich cultural heritage and diverse population. LACMA's spirit of experimentation is reflected in its work with artists, technologists, and thought leaders as well as in its regional, national, and global partnerships to share collections and programs, create pioneering initiatives, and engage new audiences.

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Day 3: Los Angeles Graffiti Tour & Hollywood

This morning you will take part in a two-hour **Graffiti Tour of Downtown Los Angeles**. Your knowledgeable guide will give you history and insight, and you may even spot one of the elusive artists at work. Stop at several unique locations including a visit to **Dejavita, Arts District Co-Op, Art Share LA, Cleveland Art**, and the **Hauser and Wirth Gallery**. You will have access to hidden spots that other people would never get a chance to see! The best part is you then get to participate in a **Workshop** with one of the amazing graffiti artists. This workshop will really challenge your ideas about the role of Art in society.

Afterwards, travel to **Hollywood** for your Behind the Scenes walking tour, including **Grauman's Chinese Theatre, Dolby Theatre** and the **Walk of Fame!** Last but not least head into **Madame Tussauds** wax museum for the opportunity to get 'up close and personal' with the stars of yesterday and today.

Day 4: Disneyland Performing Arts Workshop & Park Visit

Following breakfast, participate in a **Disney Performing Arts Workshop / Technical Theatre session**. This 3-hour, premium workshop is designed to help you gain a unique appreciation for the technical complexities of a current Disney entertainment offerings. This workshop includes a VIP viewing of the stage show itself, a brief tour of the backstage facilities of a Disneyland Resort show and a 90-minute workshop discovering the creative process of making technical magic happen.

Day 5: Stella Adler Workshops x 2

Today you get to take part in **two inspirational workshops** at the **Stella Adler Academy of Acting and Theatre**. This world-renowned acting school is located in the heart of Hollywood, California. They offer extensive training for the serious actor in theatre, film, and television.

Kick the morning off with an active, creative and highly energised **Improvisation Workshop** that encourages team building, thinking on your feet and interrelating. These are highly beneficial skills for any career.

This afternoon's workshop will be a **Film Industry Celebrity Q&A Session**. This Q&A Session is a once in a lifetime opportunity for students to interact with respected members of the Entertainment Industry in a relaxed setting. The speaker will discuss the imaginative creative process, design thinking and various elements of their art. Students will then be encouraged to interview the celebrity speaker, creating a conversation between student and professional.

Day 6: Warner Brothers Studios & Studio Tour

Day 7: J.Paul Getty Museum & Pirates Theatre Show**(B, D)**

Inspire your curiosity, understanding and enjoyment of the visual arts today with a full day at the **J. Paul Getty Museum**, commonly referred to as the Getty. The Getty is an art museum in California housed on two campuses: the Getty Center and Getty Villa. The museum collects, conserves, exhibits and interprets works of art of outstanding quality and historical importance.

Collections include European paintings, drawings, sculptures, illuminated manuscripts, decorative arts, and photography from its early beginnings to the present. Participate in a **special tour led by a Getty Museum docent** followed by free time to explore the collections, contemporary architecture and the beautiful gardens.

This evening join the world's most interactive theatre show at the **Pirate's Dinner Adventure**. Marvel at this performing arts spectacle that combines pyrotechnics, stunts and fierce sword fights. Will your pirate team come out victorious?!
